Dr. Todd Griffin is the Chair for the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Medicine at Stony Brook University Hospital. He graduated Cum Laude from the University of Rochester, received his medical degree from Stony Brook University School of Medicine and continued his training in Obstetrics and Gynecology at SBUMC, completing a residency and chief residency. He went on to serve as a Lieutenant Commander in the U.S. Navy before returning to Stony Brook. He is a Fellow in the American College of Obstetrics & Gynecology and a member of numerous national societies including the Society for Laparoscopic Surgeons, American Association of Gynecologic Laparoscopists, and the Association of Professors in Gynecology and Obstetrics. Dr Griffin specializes in Minimally Invasive and Robotic Gyn Surgery (MIS). Dr. Griffin served as the Chief Medical Officer for the Hospital from July 2009 to September 2013. He is a Former Residency Program Director and is currently the Fellowship Director for MIS. Dr. Griffin has served as an Oral Board Examiner for the American Board of Obstetrics & Gynecology since 2007. He has received a number of different local and national awards and he was one of a team at SBUMC who received the prestigious Ellison Pierce Safety Award from the American Society of Anesthesiology for their work on Simulation for the Management of Obstetrical Hemorrhage. He was also the recipient of Stony Brook University School of Medicine's highest teaching award, the Aesculapius Award.
